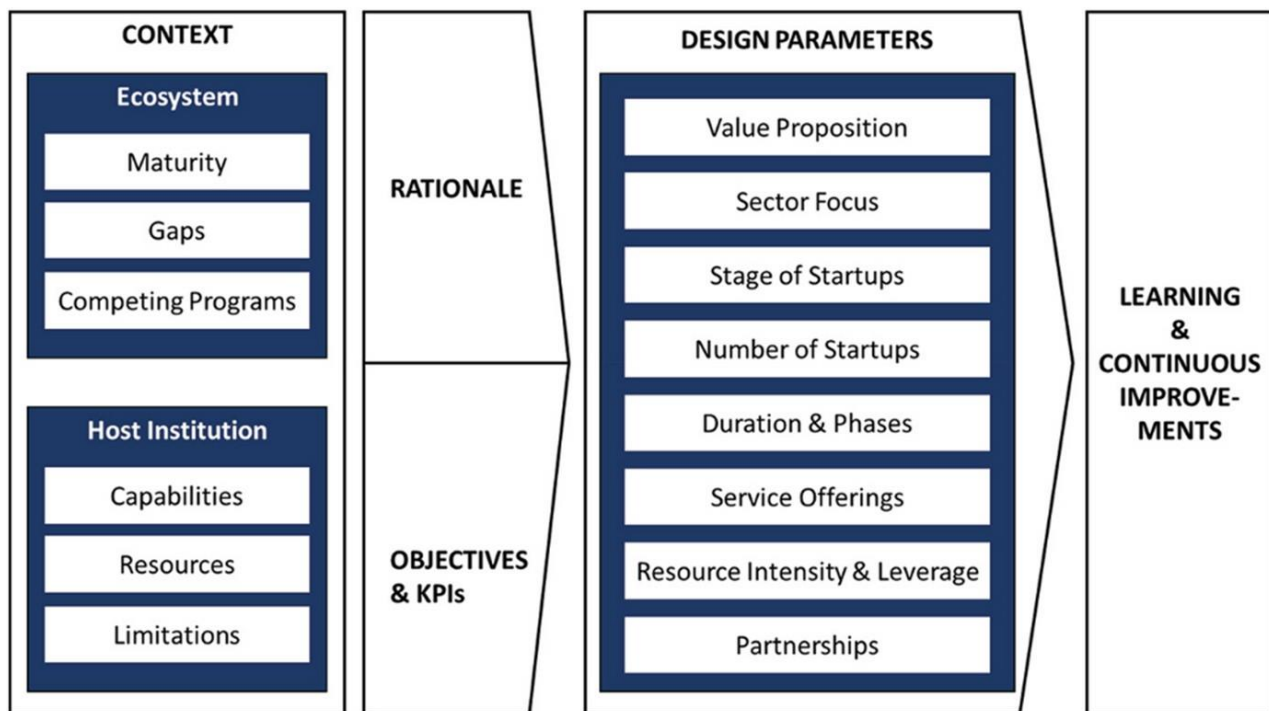

4. Who will develop the sessions?

Each start up will have:

- **Innovation Product Facilitator:** Design thinking to understand end user's expectations and to create an MVP
- **Organisational emergence and International Mentorship Board:** Finance, HR, Marketing, Strategy and Technology
- **EntreComp trainer:** Ideas & Opportunities, Resources, Into Action

The program differentiation the roles of each of the participants attending:

Startups	They will receive training from their Host facilitator, International Mentors, Entrecomp developer and will participate in a week of job shadowing in mature startups.	Each of the sessions will be coordinated directly with each of them depending on the availability of agenda of both parties, following the schedule of the program (see attached calendar). Host facilitators can participate in these sessions.
Host Facilitator	Will help the startups in the development of their entrepreneurial project. Mainly in the search for the development and/or improvement of their product.	
International Mentor	Our international team will be there to provide support on organizational issues, such as strategy, finance, marketing, HR, etc.	
Entrecomp Developer	Will help Startups in the development of entrepreneurial competencies.	
Shadowing startup	Startup that will receive the participating team assigned by the ESAP organizers, for a one week stay to learn by observing the day to day life of a mature startup.

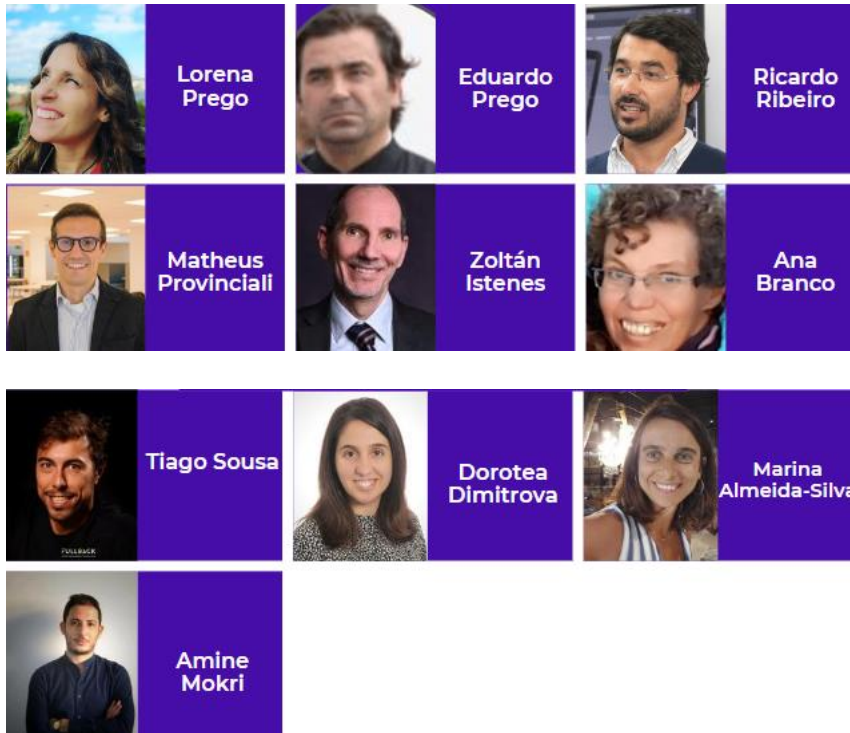

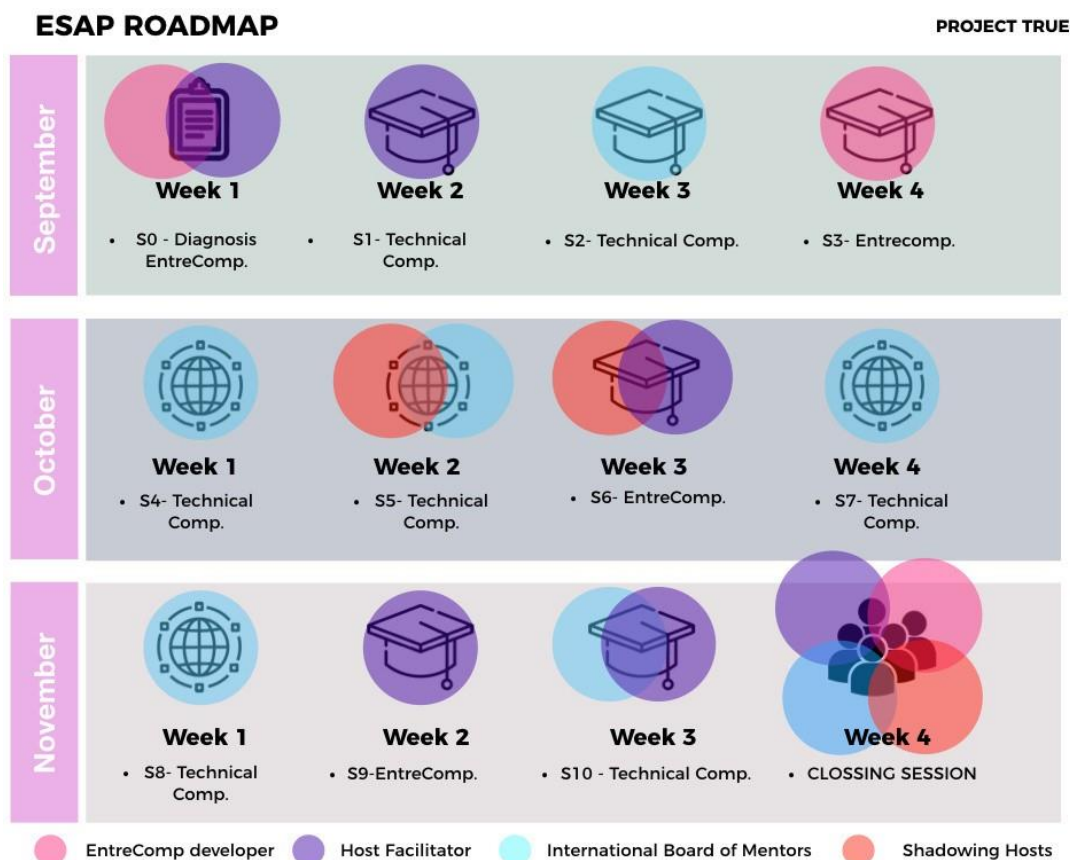

6. The ESAP 1st edition: An overview

According to the results obtained through the work guidelines and intermediate satisfaction surveys answered by 22.2% of the total number of participants, it is possible to identify that the participants are very satisfied with the programme in general, they agree that participating in the programme has been a good investment of their time and they would continue to participate in similar programmes.

Regarding the objectives proposed by the programme and by each of the teams, they fully agree that through the sessions they have worked to achieve them, the methodology has allowed them to actively participate and interact, a good working environment has been created and they would recommend other entrepreneurs to participate in the programme. In addition, they highlight that it has been a pleasant experience, with a good atmosphere for learning and linking up with other startups to generate networking and exchange experiences, which is useful for them.

Specifically on the entrepreneurial competences development sessions, which have already ended, the participants suggest extending the time of the mentoring sessions, which would allow them to carry out the activities with more time, and also to increase the number of activities similar to those of the face-to-face session, as it allows them to understand different situations in a more graphic way. On the other hand, they highlight that the sessions are dynamic with a clear guiding thread, as "*not in all programmes you learn by playing and that is a plus*", which helps to broaden the vision of the startup and identify shortcomings to work on them, in general, it has been an opportunity to learn and grow.

Regarding the sessions linked to the development of technical competences and the shadowing process, they are still under development, so the evaluation process has not yet been completed, and results are expected in a next report.
